Resolution Consideration Process Michigan Conference UCC

In preparation for being considered at the Michigan Conference Annual Meeting, a proposed Resolution will be reviewed by the following:

Resolutions will be considered at the Annual Meeting

Hearing: Resolution will be assigned to a Hearing

- 1. The Hearing will be moderated by a Neutral Moderation
- 2. 25 delegates will be randomly assigned to a Hearing for voice and vote
- 3. All other delegates and visitors are granted voice only, as time allows
- 4. The Submitter or designated proponent will have the first 20 minutes to speak to the resolution
- 5. The delegates will discern 3 pro and 3 con statements regarding the Resolution
- 6. Delegates may edit by striking "whereas statements" or amend "be it resolved statements", keeping the intent of the resolution
- 7. Amendments will require a motion, second and vote by the Hearing Delegates
- 8. Outcome of the Hearing is a recommendation to the Annual Meeting plenary with a list of 3 pros and 3 cons regarding the Resolution
 - a. Recommendation may include
 - i. Adopt
 - ii Table
 - iii. Defeat

Annual Meeting Plenary Process for Resolutions:

- 1. Up to 30 minutes will be set aside in the plenary agenda for Resolution consideration
- 2. After reading the Therefore, Be It Resolved statements in the (Amended) Resolution, the Hearing Neutral Moderator will move to adopt the resolution during plenary (Therefore, Be It Resolved statements only)
- 3. No second is necessary, as the motion comes from a committee
- 4. The Hearing Neutral Moderator will be given the first opportunity to speak to the motion
 - a. 3 pro and 3 con statements from Hearing will be highlighted
 - b. The recommendation of the Hearing will be provided
- 5. Discussion/debate by delegates of the motion with possible amendments
- 6. Vote
